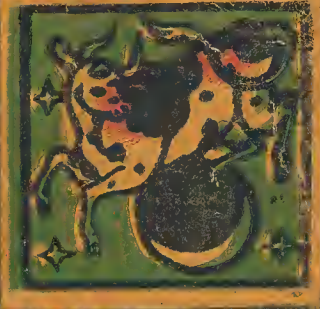

The poor Dog was laughing

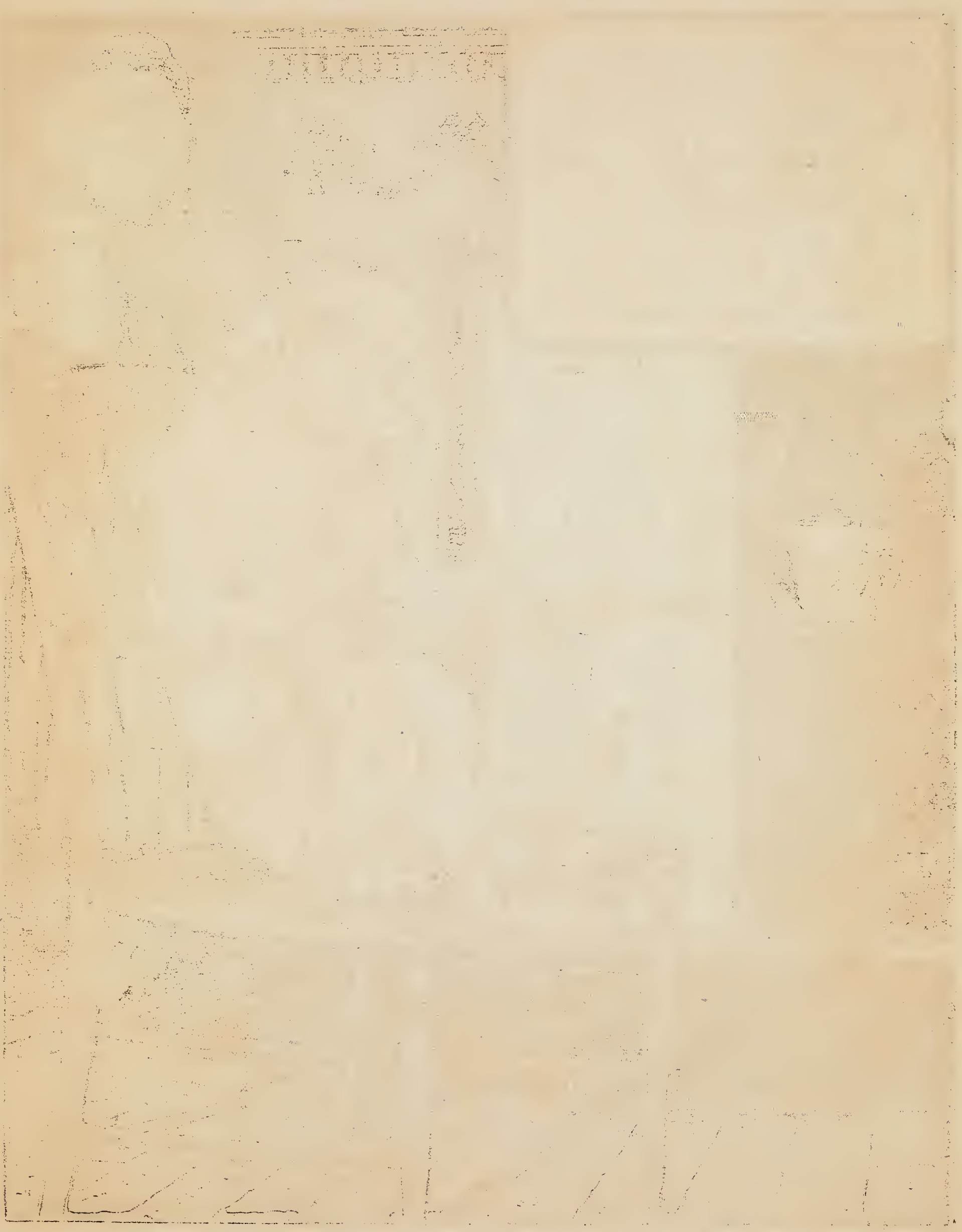

He was feeding the cat.

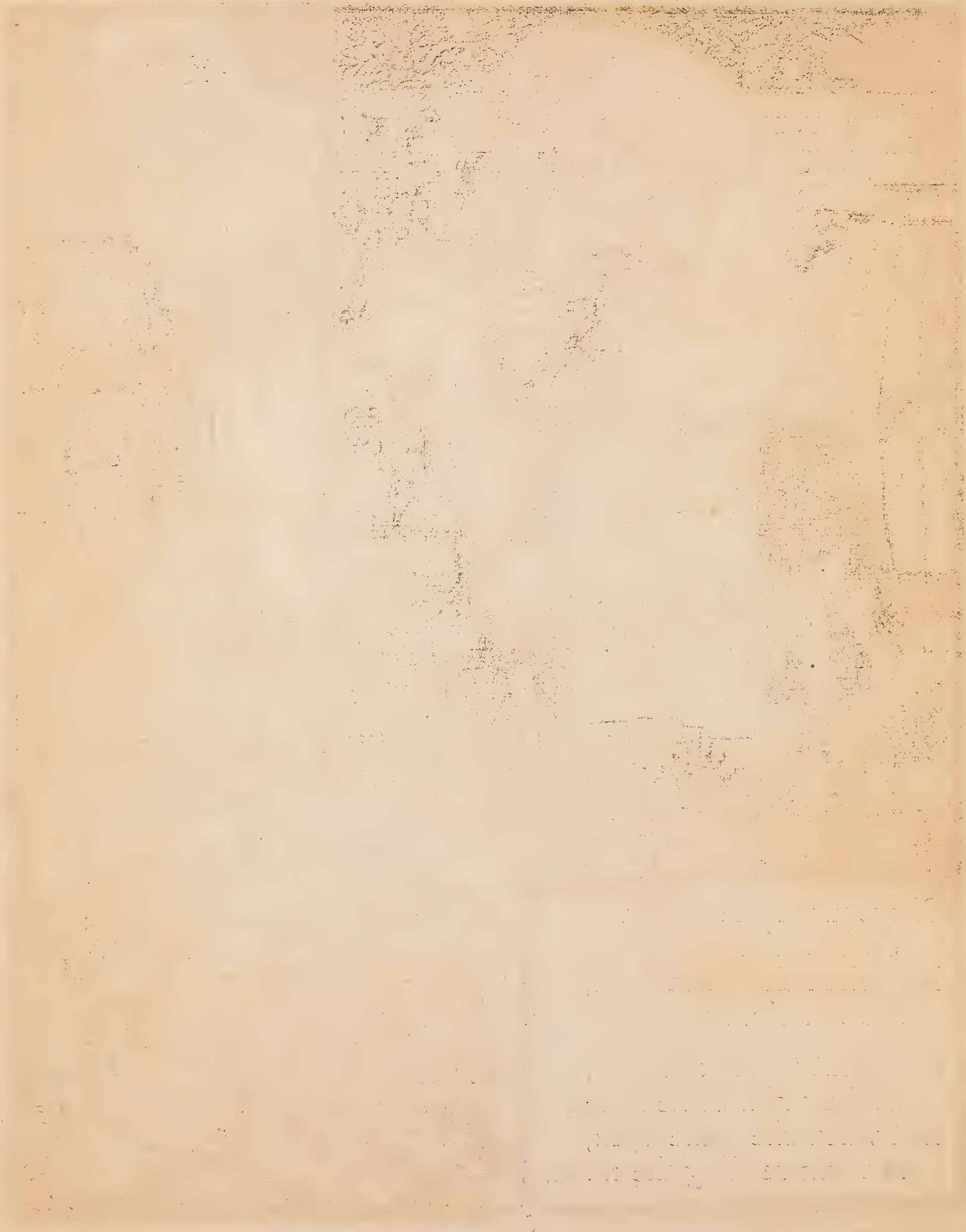


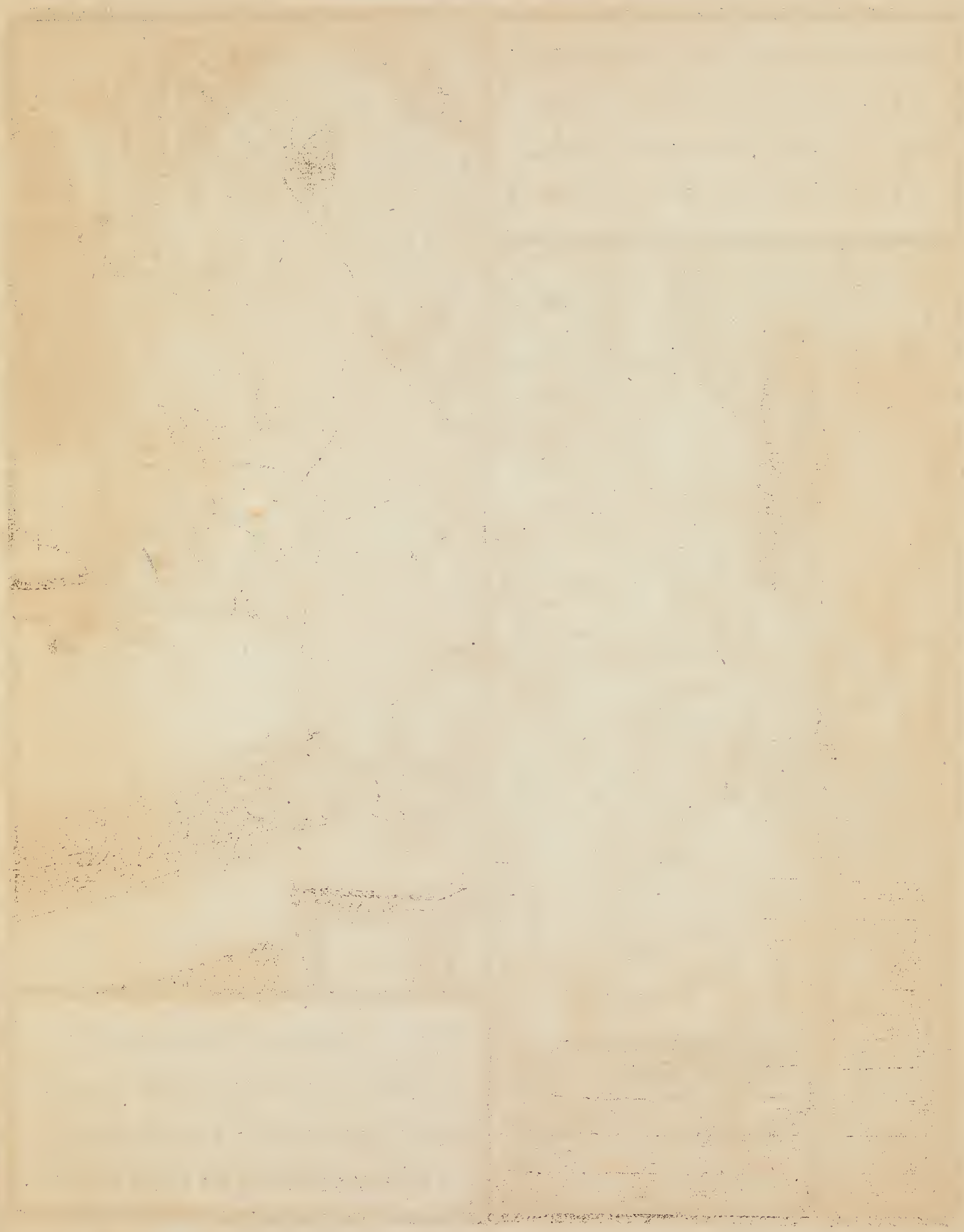
She went to the barber's

He was playing the flute

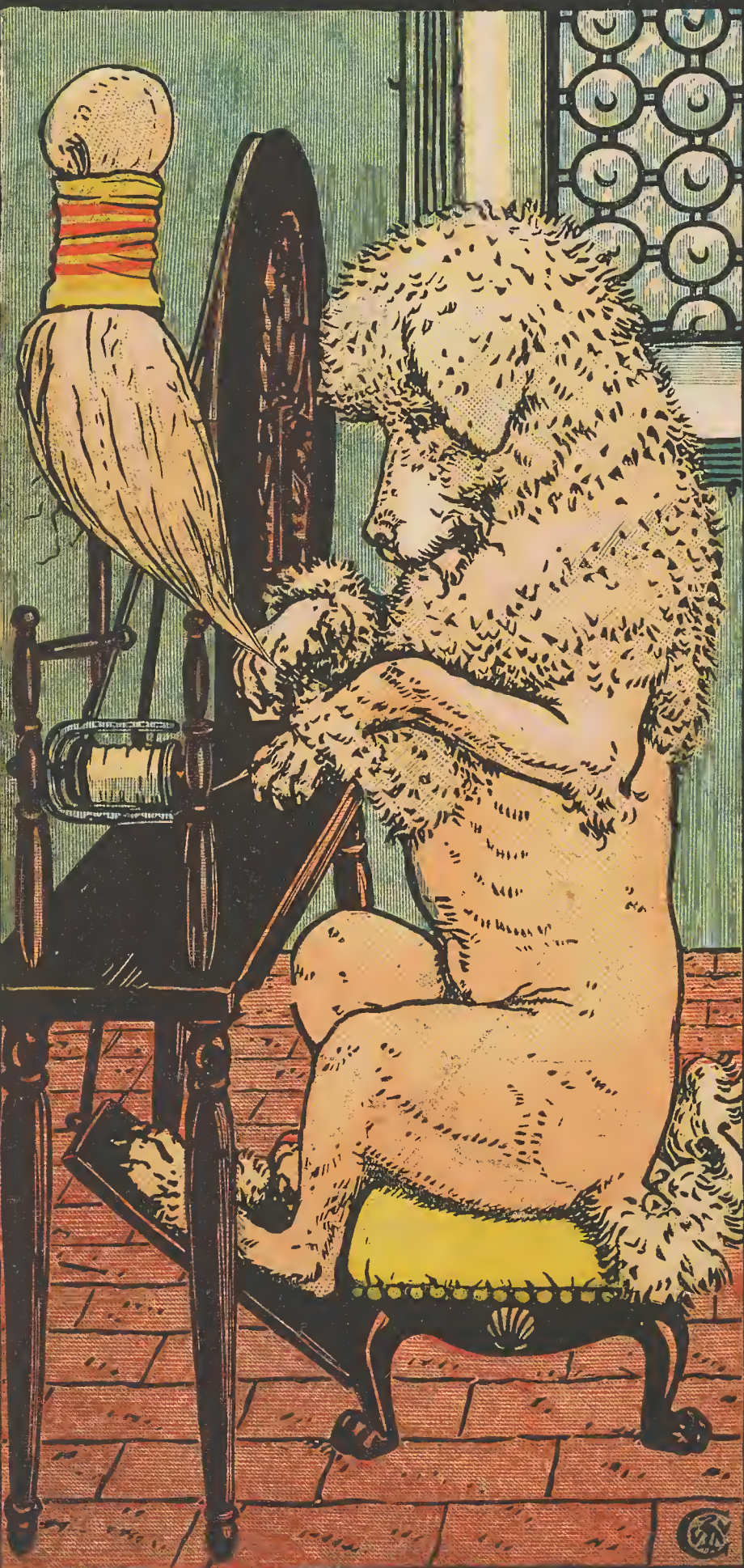


She went to the tailor's

The Dog was a-spinning.

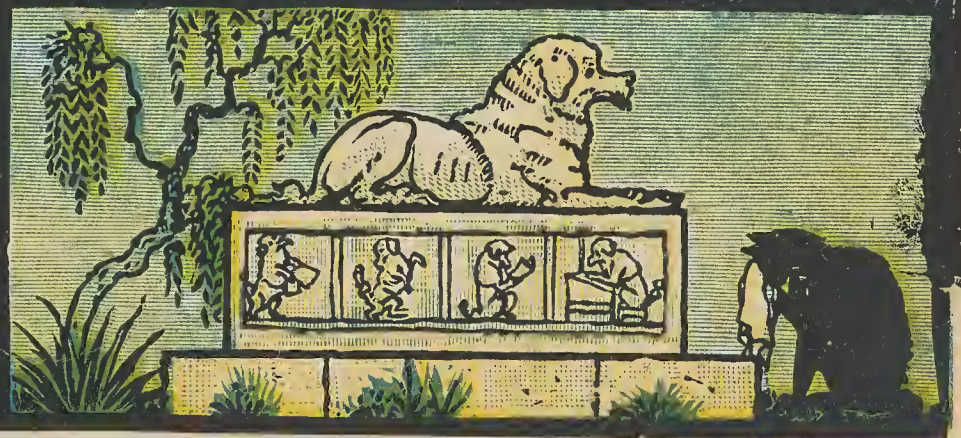


She went to the hosier's
