### 4.1. Therapeutic indications

	<p><b>Indication 1)</b> Traditional herbal medicinal product used as an expectorant in cough associated with cold.</p> <p><b>Indication 2)</b> Traditional herbal medicinal product used for symptomatic treatment of mild dyspeptic complaints such as bloating and flatulence.</p> <p><b>Indication 3)</b> Traditional herbal medicinal product used in temporary loss of appetite.</p> <p>The product is a traditional herbal medicinal product for use in specified indications exclusively based upon long-standing use.</p>

### 4.2. Posology and method of administration<sup>4</sup>

Well-established use	Traditional use
	<p><b>Posology</b></p> <p><i>Adolescents over 12 years of age, adults and elderly</i></p> <p><b>Indications 1), 2) and 3)</b></p> <p>a) Comminuted herbal substance Single dose Herbal tea: 1-2 g of the comminuted herbal substance in 250 ml of boiling water as a herbal infusion, 3 times daily. Daily dose: 3-6 g</p> <p>b) Powdered herbal substance Single dose: 225-450 mg, 3 times daily Daily dose: 675-1350 mg</p> <p>c) Expressed juice Single dose: 10-20 ml, 3 times daily Daily dose: 30-60 ml</p> <p>d) Liquid extract Single dose: 1.5-4 ml, 3 times daily</p>

	<p>Daily dose: 4.5-12 ml</p> <p>The use in children under 12 years of age is not recommended (see section 4.4 'Special warnings and precautions for use').</p> <p><b>Duration of use</b></p> <p><b>Indication 1)</b> If the symptoms persist longer than one week during the use of the medicinal product, a doctor or a qualified health care practitioner should be consulted.</p> <p><b>Indications 2) and 3)</b> If the symptoms persist longer than two weeks during the use of the medicinal product, a doctor or a qualified health care practitioner should be consulted.</p> <p><b>Method of administration</b></p> <p>Oral use.</p> <p><b>Indications 2) and 3)</b> The herbal preparations should be taken ½ hour before meal.</p>

### 4.3. Contraindications

Well-established use	Traditional use
	<p>Hypersensitivity to the active substance and to other plants of the Lamiaceae (Labiatae) family.</p> <p>Obstruction of the bile duct, cholangitis, liver disease, ileus.</p>

### 4.4. Special warnings and precautions for use

Well-established use	Traditional use
	<p>Patients with active peptic ulcer, gallstones and any other biliary disorders should consult a doctor before using Marrubii herba preparations.</p> <p>The use in children under 12 years of age has not been established due to lack of adequate data.</p> <p>If the symptoms worsen during the use of the medicinal product, a doctor or a qualified health</p>

Well-established use	Traditional use
	<p>care practitioner should be consulted.</p> <p>For extracts containing ethanol, the appropriate labelling for ethanol, taken from the 'Guideline on excipients in the label and package leaflet of medicinal products for human use', must be included.</p>

	<p>Safety during pregnancy and lactation has not been established. In the absence of sufficient data, the use during pregnancy and lactation is not recommended.</p> <p>No fertility data available.</p>

	No studies on the effect on the ability to drive and use machines have been performed.

#### ***4.8. Undesirable effects***
