	<p>Traditional herbal medicinal product for symptomatic treatment of mild seborrhoeic skin conditions.</p> <p>The product is a traditional herbal medicinal product for use in specified indication exclusively based upon long-standing use.</p>

4.2. Posology and method of administration

Well-established use	Traditional use
	<p>Posology</p> <p><i>Adults and elderly</i></p> <p>Oral use</p> <p>Herbal tea: 3 g of comminuted herbal substance as an infusion 1-3 times daily.</p> <p>The use in children and adolescents under 18 years of age is not recommended (see section 4.4 'Special warnings and precautions for use').</p> <p><i>Adolescents, adults and elderly</i></p> <p>Cutaneous use</p> <p>5-20 g/l of comminuted herbal substance as an infusion. Apply as a wet dressing to the affected areas of the skin 2-3 times daily.</p> <p>Bath additive: 5-10 g/l of comminuted herbal substance as an infusion. 1 litre of infusion to be added to the bath.</p> <p>The use in children under 12 years of the age is not recommended (see section 4.4. 'Special warnings and precautions for use').</p> <p>Duration of use</p> <p>If the symptoms persist longer than 4 weeks during the use of the medicinal product, a doctor or a qualified health care practitioner should be consulted.</p> <p>Method of administration</p>

	<p>Oral use.</p> <p>Cutaneous use.</p>
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4.3. Contraindications

	<p>Hypersensitivity to the active substance, or to salicylates.</p> <p>Cutaneous use</p> <p>Open wounds, large areas of damaged skin.</p>

4.4. Special warnings and precautions for use

Well-established use	Traditional use
	<p>Oral use</p> <p>The use in children and adolescent under 18 years of age has not been established due to lack of adequate data.</p> <p>Cutaneous use</p> <p>The use in children under 12 years of age has not been established due to lack of adequate data.</p> <p>Hot baths should not be used in case of febrile or infectious illnesses, in heart insufficiency and hypertension.</p>

4.5. Interactions with other medicinal products and other forms of interaction

	None reported.

4.6. Pregnancy and lactation

Well-established use	Traditional use
	Safety during pregnancy and lactation has not been established. In the absence of sufficient data, the use during pregnancy and lactation is not recommended.

4.7. Effects on ability to drive and use machines

	No studies on the effect on the ability to drive and use machines have been performed.

4.8. Undesirable effects

Well-established use	Traditional use
	One case of haemolysis in a child with G6PD deficiency has been reported after oral administration. The frequency is not known. If other adverse reactions not mentioned above occur, a doctor or a qualified health care practitioner should be consulted.

	No case of overdose has been reported.
